for many years an extensive merchant in Montreal. Served as an officer in the Montreal Volunteers during the war with the U. S. in 1812, and held a commission in the militia from 1811 until 1862, when he retired retaining his rank as Lieut. Colonel. Was President of the Ex. Council, Can., from March to Sept., 1848; and Provincial Secretary and Registrar from latter date until Oct 1851. Sat as mem. for East Ward of Montreal in Leg. Assembly, L. C., from g. e., 1824, until the Union between U. and L. C. in 1840. Was Mem. for Verchères in Leg. Assembly, Can., from 1841 to March, 1848, when he was summoned to the Leg. Council, where he continued to sit until the Union of 1867. Appointed to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—St. Mary's Cottage, 36, Parthenais St., Montreal.

S. of François Letellier, Esq., of St. Vallier, Co. Bellechasse, by Miss Casgrain, dau. of the late Chas. Casgrain, Esq., seignior of River Ouelle, P. Q. B. at River Ouelle. Ed. at St. Anne College. Was Minister of Agriculture, Can, from May 1863 to March 1864. Sat in Leg. Assembly Can, for Kamouraska, during the session of 1851. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same place at g. e., 1857. Represented Grandville division in Leg Council, Can., from May 1860 until the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—River Ouelle, P. Q.
