

LANDRY, PIERRE A. [*Westmoreland.*]

Of Acadian descent. S. of A. Landry, Esq., who sat for Westmoreland in N.B. Assembly from 1846, almost uninterruptedly, up to 1870, when he retired from Parlt., by Pelagie Casey. B. in Dorchester, N.B., 1 May, 1846. Ed. at St. Joseph's College, Memramcook. Called to the Bar, N.B., 1870. M., Sept., 1872, Bridget, youngest dau. of Mr. Timothy McCarthy, of Fredericton. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Dorchester.*

LINDSAY, Hon. WILLIAM. [*Carleton.*]

B. in Irèl. A merchant. Has been a mem. of the County Council of Carleton. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, without office, from 1868, and Surveyor-Genl., from Oct. 1870, to Feb., 1871, when he retired with the other members of Govt. Has sat for present seat since 1862 A Liberal.—*Woodstock.*

MCPHERSON, CHARLES. [*York.*]

Sat for present seat before the Union. Again, returned at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Fredericton.*

MCQUEEN, Hon. ANGUS. [*Westmoreland.*]

B. at Little Harbour, Pictou, N.S. A merchant. Apptd. a mem. of Ex. Council, 17 Jan.,
