duly qualified as hereinbefore provided: and the first meeting to be held for the purpose of such election as aforesaid, shall be held on the day and at the place to be appointed as hereinbefore provided, and every following annual general meeting for the same purposes shall be held on a corresponding day of the same month in every following year, (unless said day should be a holyday, and then the next day,) and 10 at such place as the Managing Committee shall notify; and the signature of the President, or in his absence of any member of the Managing Committee whom the said Committee shall appoint, shall be sufficient 15 attestation of all proceedings had, or notices to be issued by the said Association: Provided always, that if any such election shall not be had on the day appointed for the same, the Corporation shall not be 20. dissolved, but such election shall be had onany subsequent day to be notified as aforesaid, and the Managing Committee and officers aforesaid shall continue in office until: others shall be elected in their stead; and 25 the day of annual election may always be changed by any By-law of the Corporation.

By-laws, how made.

V. And be it enacted, That the By-laws of the Corporation shall be made by the said Managing Committee, and being so made, 30 and signed by a majority of the said Committee, and the seal of the Corporation being thereunto affixed, shall be binding on all the Members of the Corporation, and shall be kept open to their Inspection.

And be it enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Association, at such first meeting for the election of officers and at every following annual general meeting, to elect by ballot two Visiting Committees, one to consist of nine ladies, members of the Association, and the other of nine gentlemen, members of the Association, (each of which Committees shall from time to time,
