Public Instruction, by which latter authority no Local Super-partment of intendent shall be appointed who is not acquainted with the Public Inssystem of teaching and discipline practised in the Provincial truction. Normal and Model Schools, and with the use of the various 5 kinds of school apparatus, as well as with the School Law generally.

23. A Local Superintendent shall have the same authority Local Superto suspend for the time being a provincial certificate of teacher's intendent qualifications, and report the same forthwith to the Chief Su-may suspend a Provincial Provincial Teacher's cering in writing the teacher, whose certificate is suspended, the tificate. reasons of it; and the Chief Superintendent shall finally decide upon the case.

24. It shall be competent for the Chief Superintendent of Chief Super-15 Education, should be deem it expedient, to submit any ques-intendent may tion arising under the Grammar or Common School Acts, to refer certain questions to the Superior Courts for their opinion and decision.

25. It shall be the duty of the Chief Superintendent of Copies of Education to cause to be printed by the printer of the Legis- Chief Super-20 lative Assembly for the time being, under his direction, a intendents' sufficient number of copies of his annual Report to supply each distributed, School and Municipal Corporation, Local Superintendent and &c. County Board of Public Instruction in Upper Canada.

26. It shall be lawful for the Chief Superintendent of Edu-Chief Super-25 cation to assist Mechanics' Institutes and all other institutions intendent may receiving Legislative aid in Upper Canada, to establish and assist Mechamaintain libraries, and procure maps and school apparatus, tutes, to esupon the same terms as such things are now supplied by the tablish Libra-Educational Department to township and school municipalities, ries, &c. 30 in proportion to the sums which they have transmitted to him or

may transmit for such purposes, in the same manner to establish prizes of books and other publications in public schools and other institutions aided by the Legislature.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.

27. The Grammar School Fund shall be apportioned to Apportion-35 Counties, upon the same terms and conditions as the Fund ment of fund. provided by the Legislature in aid of Common Schools.

28. The Corporation of each County shall annually levy and Rate to be collect a rate for the support of Grammar Schools in the same imposed for manner, and subject to the same conditions and restrictions, as Grammar 40 such Corporations levy and collect rates for the support of Schools, &c. Common Schools; and the unexpended balances of Grammar School moneys over from any one year, shall be added to and form part of the Grammar School Fund of the next year.
