Castle said the constituencies that have recently formed student centre committees are the Creative Arts

Board, McLaughlin College, the Jewish Student Federation and the History Students Association.

Presently CYSF is finalizing its own committees, consisting of appointed executive and constituency members. The four committees will include the Main Committee, Servi-

ces and Facilities, the Finance Committee, and the Campaign Committee.

"Basically Rob (Castle) and I will sit on all committees," Blink said, with Blink chairing the Main Committee. "With the exception of the Main Committee (which will be

smaller), most committees will have about 10 members each, with the Campaign being the largest," he added.

Castle said the Campaign Committee had their first meeting on November 11. "It will be a geographical campaign, rather than a polit-

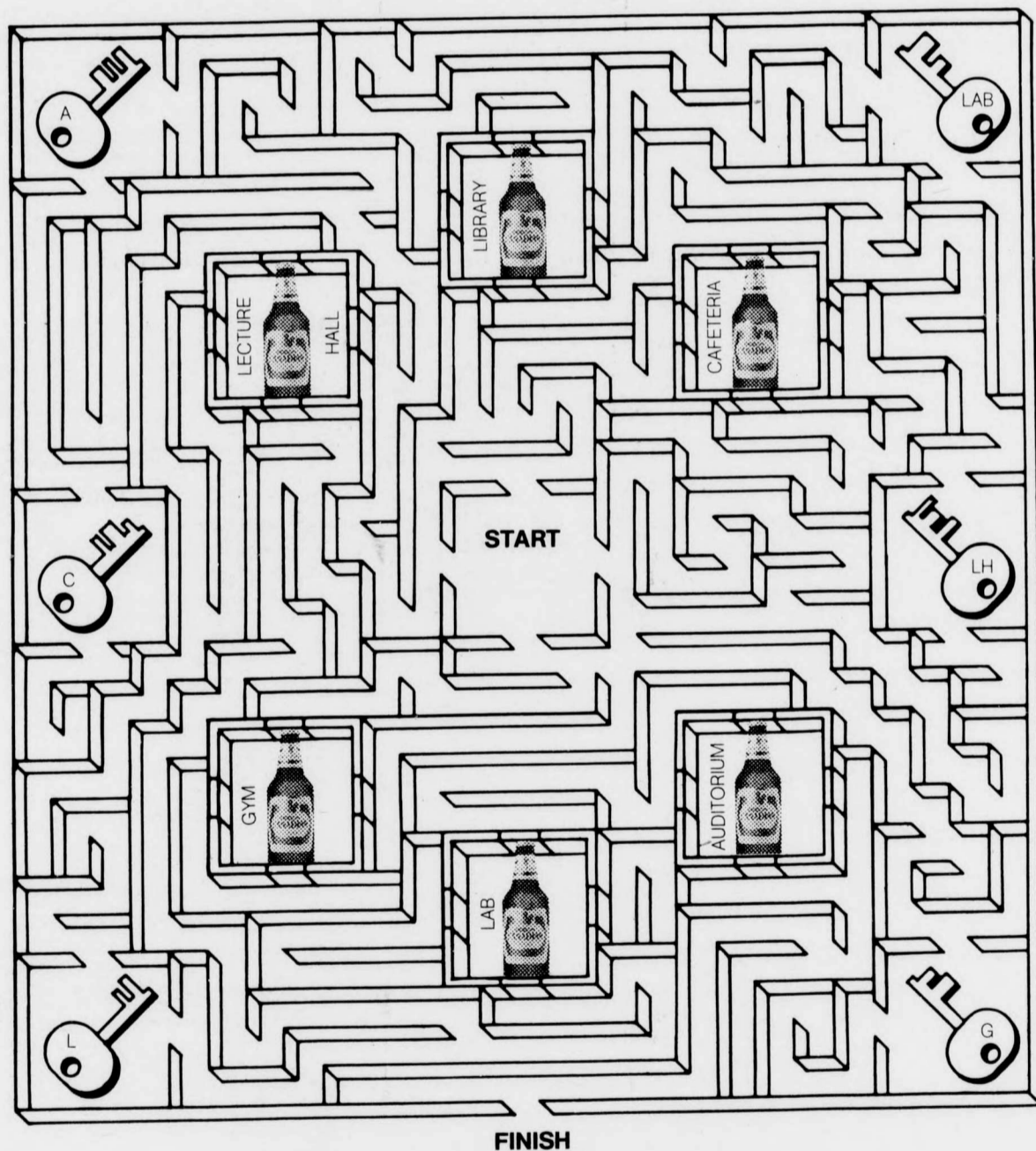
