

> The move came at the annual general meeting of Mississauga's largest minor sports organization. Delegates from various member areas attended the gathering at Huron Park Recreation Centre Theatre this week, preparing blueprints for next year and electing a slate of officers.

As expected, last year's 1st vice-president (and acting chief of the staff for the closing months of the season) Bill Cornell was elected president for the 1973-74 campaign.
