

catching Salmon for their own or their families use, by means of day spears, and in the day time only, the use of flambeaux or any and every other mode of fishing or killing Salmon, whether by day or night being hereby strictly prohibited after the aforesaid period, under the penalty, as relates to Indians, of the forfeiture of the fishing tackle and furniture found in possession of the offender, and of one month's imprisonment in case of a repetition of the like offence. —
