Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th instant in further reference to supplies for the Alnwick Indian School.

In reply I beg to say that on November 30th the teacher advised the Department that he had received five parcels by mail and that they contained only the readers. From your letter it would appear that "The Canadian Teacher" is sent direct to the Agent and the Department would like to know if an arrangement could not be made to have the copies of "School and Home" and "The Canadian Teacher" sent direct from Toronto to F. J. Joblin, Teacher, Alderville, Ont. The subscription to "The Canadian Teacher" and "School and Home", should have covered the whole year which commences on September 1st, and it might still be possible to have sent to the teacher the required number of copies of the seven issues since that date. Your letter of the 10th instant covers three of these issues, but which particular ones the Department does not know. It may be, however, that you have this information.

This is one of our best Indian day schools and the Department is very anxious that the teacher should be as well equipped for his work as possible.
