

Ottawa, December 28, 1916.

Sir:-

I have your communication of the 21st instant, enclosing Bank draft for the sum of \$1196.40 as payment of the amount due on the first instant covering the N.W.1/4 of Section 3, the fractional S.E.1/4 and the fractional S.W.1/4 of 3, and to advise that the Departments letter of the 5th instant should have stated that the amount payable on the first instant amounted to \$1,336.65, composed of \$954.75 principal and \$381.90 interest. The interest is computed on the outstanding balance and not on the instalments due or payable.

In accordance with this corrected statement, the amount you were good enough to forward is \$140.25 short of the due amount. I have therefore to request you to kindly forward the balance on receipt of this communication.

In addition to the \$140.25, you will forward the assignment fees amounting to \$3.00.
