

The present monograph constitutes the third part of volume III (quarto) of Contributions to Canadian Palaeontology and is descriptive of the skull and certain other parts of the skeleton of the large carnivorous dinosaur *Dryptosaurus inersatus* (Cope). The fossil remains now described by Mr. Lambe were collected by officers of this department from the Edmonton series of the Cretaceous system of the North-west Territory of Canada. A preliminary description of the skull, by Professor Edward D. Cope, based on the same material, was published, in 1892, without illustrations.

Part I of this volume, on Vertebrate Species from the Oligocene or Lower Miocene beds of the Cypress Hills, by Professor Cope, appeared in 1891.

Part II, on Vertebrata of the Mid-Cretaceous (Belly River series) by Professor Henry F. Osborn and Mr. Lawrence M. Lambe, was published in 1902.

The present part, continuing the series of descriptive and illustrated quarto memoirs on fossil Vertebrata of the North-west Territory, consists of twenty-six pages of letter-press with text figures and eight photogravure plates.

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
