She spoke in Toronto recently at the great Convention of the "World's League Against Alcoholism." This book is written in a most interesting manner and has 18 illustrations. It reveals the marvellous help that Indian girls gave in the movement against the liquor traffic, which was destroying the manhood of the Punjab. Eight hundred joined the Temperance Society in Pathankot. The movement spread until a Temperance Hall was built and other societies formed. To-day there is prohibition in the Punjab.
