## CAP. LT.

An Act to incorporate the Clarenceville Academy.

[Assented to 18th March, 1865.]

Preamble.

HEREAS certain inhabitants of the Protestant Parish of St. George de Clarenceville, in the County of Missisquoi, have, by their petition, prayed to be incorporated under the name of the "Clarenceville Academy," and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

Certain persons incorporated.

Corporate name and powers.

1. The Reverend Micajah Townsend, Rector of the Parish of St. George de Clarenceville; Amos H. Vaughan, John Hunter, William Chilton, Sylvester Row, John Macfie, Charles Stewart, Asahel Hawley and Daniel Salls, Esquires, and such other persons as shall succeed them in office as Rector for the time being of the said parish in communion with the United Church of England and Ireland, and Trustees of the said Academy, shall be and are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate in deed and in name, under the name of the "Clarenceville Academy" for the purposes of general Education, and shall by that name have perpetual succession, and a common seal, with power to alter, renew or change the same at pleasure; and with power also by the said corporate name to sue and be sued in all Courts of Justice, and shall have power at all times hereafter to purchase, acquire, accept and receive by donation or otherwise, and hold and possess for themselves and their successors, such lands and tenements as may be nece sary for the actual use and occupation of the said corporation not exceeding in annual value two thousand dollars, and may sell and alienate the same, and acquire others in their stead, by any title whatsoever, for the uses and purposes aforesaid.

First Trustees appointed.

Their duties, &c.

2. The said Amos H. Vaughan, John Hunter, William Chilton, Sylvester Row, John Macfie, Charles Stewart, Asahel Hawley, Daniel Salls, and the Rector for the time being of the said parish in communion with the United Church of England and Ireland, and their successors in office, shall be Trustees of the said Corporation, and shall have the control, management and government thereof, as well in regard to the employment and payment of competent teachers, and a secretary-treasurer. as the receipt, investment and management of the revenues and property pertaining thereto, and may make such rules and regulations, not contrary to law or to the provisions of this Act, for the government and management of the affairs and property of the said corporation, and for all purposes relating to the well being thereof, and for the proceedings of the said trustees in the performance of their duties, as from time to time may seem
