whom was referred the Bill for applying a further fum of one thousand pounds, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of His Majetly's Receiver General, towards the improvement of the inland navigation of this Province, between Montreal and Lake Saint Francis; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, with the Bill, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk once throughout.

On motion of Mr. Roy Portelance, seconded by Mr. Planté,

Ordered, That the question of concurrence be now put on the amendment reported from the Committee, to the Bill.

And the faid amendment being again read, it was, upon the question, agreed unto by the House:

ORDERED, That the Bill, as amended, be ingroffed.

The House, according to order, proceeded to take into consideration the report of the Committee appointed to enquire into the Authors, Printers and Publishers of a Libel contained in the Montreal Gazette of the first of April last, Number 503.—

And the said report being read:-

Mr. Bedard moved, seconded by Mr. Bertbelot,

That the question of concurrence be now severally put upon each of the resolutions of the committee.

Mr. Richardson moved, seconded by Mr. Moore,

To amend the motion, by leaving out all the words thereof, after concurrence," and infert, "be put upon the faid refolutions the third day of May next."
