time spent therein the speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported progress and asked leave to sit again.

On Motion of Mr. Holland leave was given to bring in a Petition of fundry persons complaining against the clause proposed to be introduced into the intended application for aid out of the Quit Rent Fund.

On Motion the House entered into the immediate consideration theresof, and afterwards Ordered on Motion of Mr. Stewat, Jun. That the further consideration thereof lie over until to-morrow at ten o'clock.

A Message from His Majesty's Council by their Clerk, informing the House that the Honorable Robert Gray and Alex: Howe, be a Committee to meet the Committee of the House of Assembly for the purpose of corresponding with the Colony Agents during the recess.

The House went into a Committee of the whole House, J. F. Holland, Esq. in the Chair to resume the consideration of the Bill, entitled "An Act "for ascertaining, laying out and fixing the Lines and Boundaries of three "Counties, and of the differences between Parties, when it appears that "the Settlements or improvements have been made by mistake on one "Township for another, and also for raising by assessment a sufficient Fund, "out of which to defray the expences of ascertaining, laying out and fixing "the said boundary Lines;" after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported progress and asked leave to sit again.

The House adjourned till ten o'clek to morrow.
