Distinguished Scientist Dead

James M. Macoun, Head of Biological Division at Ottawa Was Belleville Nativ.

James Melville Macoun, C.M.G., F.L.S., one of the most famous of Canadian scientists and one of Belleville's most distinguished sons died at his home in Ottawa this morning at the age of 87 years. He was born in Belleville Nov. 7th, 1832, a son of the late John Macoun, a botanist and biologist of international reputation.

James Melville Macoun entered the Canadian Geological Survey Service November 1883. From 1892 to 1895 he was one of the British representatives at the Behring Straits arbitration at Paris. He was a Forest Commissioner in 1896-1897 and had been, since July 1898, assistant Naturalist and Curator of the Herbarium in the Biological Division of which in March, 1917, he was appointed Botanist and Head. He was appointed Forestry Commissioner for Canada and as such secured a forestry exhibition for the Paris Exhibition in 1899. He was a prominent member of the Canadian Forestry Association and the Ottawa Field Naturalist Club and editor of the journals published by each of these bodies. He was honored by His Majesty and made a commander of the order of St. Michael and St. George in recognition of his services.

Mr. Macoun was twice married. His first wife was Mary Macleann, daughter of Rev. Kenneth Macleann, whom he married in January, 1859. She died May 2nd, 1902. His second wife was Helen Douglas, daughter of the late Rev. William Scott, the marriage taking place in June, 1904. He was a member of the University Club at Ottawa, and a Presbyterian in religion. His home was 192 Waverley Street, Ottawa.

Dr. Macoun, of Campbellford is a nephew.

John Macoun, the father of deceased, was born near Albert College and taught in the old school near the college, besides lecturing in Albert College. He went to British Columbia on the order of the Government, wrote on the flora of the west, and was the first to bring the Pacific coast to the attention of the public. His writings were standard scientific works. He had another son, L. E. Macoun, who is in the federal government employ at the head of one of the departments.

John Macoun removed to Ottawa when his family was young.

A Collector of Customs Dead

W. T. Ross Passed Away at Toronto On Tuesday.

Walter T. Ross collector of customs at Picton died in Wallealee Hospital, Toronto, on Tuesday. Mr. Ross had been ill for several weeks before going to the city but had recovered sufficiently to make the journey. He was accompanied by Mrs. Ross. He entered Wallealee Hospital and last week was operated on for kidney trouble by the surgeons of that institution. The announcement of his death was received with very general regret in Picton. Mr. Ross had been collector of customs at the Port of Picton since the spring of 1823.

He was born in Picton a son of the late Walter Ross who represented Prince Edward county in both the parliament of Canada and the Ontario legislature. In 1846 Walter T. Ross enlisted in the 18th Battalion of the Fenian raid. He continued as paymaster of the 16th for many years. He was appointed secretary of Picton Horticultural Society in 1896, an institution in which he was greatly interested. He continued to act in this position until a year ago.

Mr. Ross married Miss Bockus, a member of a family prominent in the early history of Prince Edward county. Of their family two sons and one daughter survive. Gordon is with the Bank of Montreal at Brantford, and Percy with the Bank of Nova Scotia at Toronto and their daughter, Mrs. Wilkin, lives in Toronto. A brother Fred lives in Chicago. The funeral took place on Friday at St. Mary Magdalene Church.
