SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST
LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male
18 years of age, may homestead a
quarter-section of available Dominion land
in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. An
applicant must appear in person at the Do-
minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for
the District. Entry by proxy will be made
at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not
Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each of three
years. A homesteader may live within
nine miles of his homestead on a farm of
at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A
habitable house is required except where
residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in
good standing may pre-empt a quarter-
section adjacent to his homestead. Price
\$200 per acre.

A settler who has exhausted his home-
stead right may take a purchased home-
stead in certain districts. Price \$200 per
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in
each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and
 erect a house worth \$200.

The area of cultivation is subject to re-
duction in case of rough, scrubby or stony
land. Live stock may be substituted for
cultivation under certain conditions.

CRISIS HAS
PASSED FOR
RUSS ARMY

Has Come Through Terrible
Ordeal of Last Spring and
Summer Unbroken.

By Special Wire to the Courier.
London, Oct. 25.—The following
statement from a high authority re-
presenting the views of the Russian
staff regarding the Russian military
situation, has been received here from
the correspondent of the Times at
Russian headquarters.

"From May till October the Rus-
sian army has been subjected to un-
interrupted blows along a front of
700 miles. The Austro-Germans have
applied every possible means, not ex-
cepting such as are forbidden by in-
ternational treaties, in order to in-
crease the pressure against us. Masses
of their troops were flung against
this front and sent to destruction re-
gardless of losses. Military history
does not afford another example of
such pressure."

"During these months of contin-
uous and prolonged action, the high
qualities and the metal of our troops
