MODELLED CRAWLING PANTHER THAT CREATED SENSATION.

Boston Globe Characterized It As One Student John Wilson.

One of the sensations of the annual exhibition of the Boston Art Club of this year was a small sculpturesque study of a crawling panther. The Art Club shows do not usually contain a great deal of sculpture, and the paintings of one kind and another are apt to absorb all the attention of critics and visitors. On the opening day of this exhibition, however, the art writers of the Boston daily newspapers gathered around this plece of work with keen admiration. Not for a long time had Boston seen a bit of original animal sculpture that seemed so instinct with vitality and energy as this representation of the great feline of the north woods.

Some of the critics wondered who the sculptor could be, and were told by others, better informed, that the panther was modelled by a young man, a Canadian, still a student in the school of the Museum of Fine Arts.

"I believe thoroughly in the field for a sculptor of animal life." he said, after explaining his motives in making a number of the little sketches. "The sculptor to succeed along the lines established by Barye must be absolutely familiar with both animal forms and animal life.


