Colts should be taught to eat grain with their dam before they are weaned. Teach them to stand tied with a halter. About six months of age is the proper time to wear a strong colt. Many good horsemen prefer to wean them at once, while others wean them more gradually, allowing them to suck once or twice a day before they are taken away entirely. When the colt is taken away the mare should be watched, and her udder should be bathed at least once every day with cold water and spirits of camphor. This dries up the milk glands and prevents the udder from becoming caked and feverish. I believe that the colt should be trained to do light work during the third year.
