Farmers From Home.

To the Editor of the Post:

Sir,—It is strange that farmers, whose work, stock, real estate and families are home, should be away from home so much themselves. Of course I do not refer to our most prosperous farmers, but the average man of agriculture is most frequently on the streets, on the drive, in the town—more frequently than the doctor or the minister. He drives east and west, north and south, wherever there is any road. One hundred and eighty-two and a half mortal days of the year, we may find the average farmer from home. He is known by the almost incessant use he makes of the Queen's highways. The men we never see from home, who never drive, but work away, are tradesmen and mechanics.

The farmer's business is at home. No class of men should be so much at home as farmers. They should watch and guard their stock, crops and all their farming interests, as next to the interest of their souls. Every farmer may set this down as an axiom: When he is from home he is losing something at home. Some job of work that should be done just then, is not done, and less results. Some animal is either going into mischief or coming out of it, or some other animal is not in good health, or some member of the family is ill, and the rest doing more than they are able to do, and perhaps shortening their days. Cows are carrying their freighted udders through the pastures or woods, the milk undrawn; and instances are many of farmers losing cows and other stock by being away from home. It is most unreasonable as well as more unprofitable for farmers to be so much from home. Home is where the farmer should live, enjoy life, and help his family and attend to his care, to enjoy life and be where he should be, in the place where he can live in no longer. The backward state of agricultural interests, is largely due to farmers making so much use of the public roads, and so little use of their farming facilities. It is just to expect the farmer who is away from home a month of his time will soon have a home to go to.
