Home Ru Bill Passed.

Special to Evening Telegram.

LONDON, May 25. The Home Rule Bill for Ireland passed its third and final reading it the Commons to-day. It now becomes law automatically, under the opera tion of the Parliament Act.

The provisions in the Home Rule Bill which passed the Commons yesterday, are as follows:

A Senate of forty members, and a House of Commons of one hundred and sixty-four members.

The Irish Parliament cannot legis late on peace or war, or navy, army or any naval or military force; for eign relations or trade outside Ire land, except certain defined legisla tion: coinage or tender.

It cannot make any law, either di rectiy or indirectly, to establish o endow any religion; or prohibit free exercise thereof or give preference privilege or advantage or impose an disability or disadvantage on accoun of religious belief or religious or ec clesiastical status; or make religiou belief or religious ceremony a con dition of the validity of marriage.

Temporary restrictions are place on legislation on land purchases, ol age pensions, national insurance, lab or exchanges, the Royal Irish Con stabulary, post offices and other say ings banks, and friendly societies.

The executive remains invested i the Sovereign or his representatives forty-two members will still be sen from . Ireland to the House of Com mons; the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council to give final decisions as to constitutional validity of an Act passed by the Irish Parliament.

The Irish Exchequer to defray cost of Irish administration, except for re served services mentioned above: th Imperial Exchequer to pay an annua sum to the Irish Exchequer, starting at \$2,500,000 a year, and eventually after six years becoming a permanent payment of \$1,000,000 annually.
