

NINETY BOMBS DROPPED UPON LONDON.

LONDON: June 1.

Ninety bombs were dropped in a killed and a few injured: no public buildings were damaged. This information was given out officially to-day. as follows: In amplification of the information which appeared in this morning's newspapers, the following particulars of last night's Zeppelin raid in the metropolitan area, are now available for publication. Last night about ninety bombs, mostly or an incendiary character, were dropped from hostile aircraft in various localities not far distant from each other.
