Codfish-All the markets except Spain have weakened more or less the past week. This is mainly attributable to cover-supply. The increase in consumption that is likely to set in during this month will very likely re-lieve this condition of affairs and strengthen prices back to December figures. This week Oporto consumed 2,000 gtls, roundly more than the previous week. The same rate of increase is expected in other markets oming on to the Lenten season. The Brazil market is said to have declined two shillings this week, but may recover on short supply for the spring. The exports this week were as follows: By S.S. Other feeds also have gone up this week 10 to 15 cents per sack following wheat and oats. There is not likely to be any decline in prices while the heavy period of consumption is on.




