



The mayor will issue a proclamatio declaring Friday, May 9, Arbor Day a public holiday. Schools, banks, places of business, civic departments, shops and factories are all expected to observe it and to participate in the cleaning up of all premises in the city. This is the first concerted effort towar

a general clean-up in several years and big preparations are being made by the various city officials in charge.

The observance of Arbor Day is a general thing in most cities. In fact, in some American cities where cleanliness is a matter of civic patriotism one day every a matter of civic patriotism one day every month is made a statutory holiday for cleaning up. In the city of Omaha, where City Engineer Craig formerly lived, this practice was followed very successfully.
