HEAVY SNOW STORM

Blockades Electric and Country Roads in the East.

Melrose, N. Y., Jan. 12.—A heavy snowstorm prevailed throughout Northern New York. About a foot of snow has fallen in the last twelve hours.

Cornwall, Jan. 12.—A heavy snowstorm prevailed here. The electric road is blocked completely. Railway trains are all late.

Ottawa, Jan. 12.—A heavy snowstorm has prevailed here since last night, and reports received this morning show that the storm is general throughout the Ottawa Valley. From six to twelve inches of the "beautiful" has fallen, and the result is the almost complete blocking of the country roads in certain sections. The trains are all running more or less behind time. The weather is mild.

WAR ON FAITH HEALERS

New York Doctors Propose to Bar Them From Practice.

New York, Jan. 14.—The board of censors of the Medical Society of the county of New York has addressed a circular letter to members calling attention to the fact that there are many persons practicing medicine in open defiance of the law providing that before one may practice medicine in this state a certificate of proficiency shall be obtained from the board of regents in the university of the state. This is granted only after a satisfactory examination. The purpose of the society to begin an active crusade against these illegal practitioners is announced.

C. S. Andrews, who has been retained as counsel, said: "There is one kind of a quack we cannot touch, and yet who does more harm than all the other illegal practitioners put together. I refer to the Christian Science healers. Through their religious professions they have a clientele of patients which it would be impossible for an ordinary quack to obtain. The court of appeals has practically decided that the practice of the art of healing consists of the prescribing of medicine. This purely technical definition puts the faith healer charlatans beyond the

LONDON SUPPLIED WITH GOOD MILK.

Average Quality Over 4 Per Cent of Butter Fat—One Dealer Disqualified.

Following is Health Officer Hutchinson's semi-annual report upon the quality and condition of London's milk supply:

The Chairman and Board of Health-Gentlemen,—I herewith submit my semi-annual report upon the inspection of herds, dairies and market milk for the half-year ending Dec. 1. As heretofore, the herds, byres and dairies are classified according to milk, A, B and C, and the milk 1, 2 and 3. One vendor whose percentage was 3.75, protested, and was given 3.80 by the public analyst. The average percentage of all the market milk, exclusive of that with cream added, was a fraction over four.

The quality of milk supplied the city is still good. The average percentage of 213 samples of market milk examined during the year, exclusive of 13 samples examined for private persons, was over 4 per cent. The samples were cleaner than in former years, and to this and the good quality may be attributed the small number of deaths of infants from derangement of the digestive organs.

Nine thousand quarts are sold daily in the city. Two samples had been watered, one had cream added, and one byer was unfit for dairy purposes by reason of uncleanliness. One hundred and forty persons are employed in supplying the city with milk.
