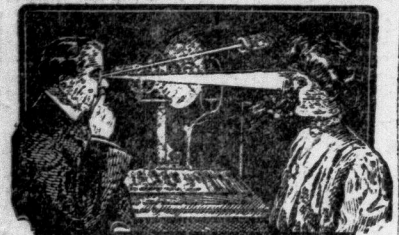

HENRY FORD GIVES HELP TO DETROIT BY \$500,000 LOAN

The Motor Magnate Advances Money to City at Low Interest.

BEATS WALL STREET
Assistance Will Permit Paying the Civic Employees' Wages.

Detroit, May 24.—Henry Ford was seen as a competitor with Wall street today when it became known that he had advanced the city \$500,000 on a short loan, and that within the next few days he will lend \$1,500,000 more. The \$500,000 went through the Bank of Detroit this morning.
In making these loans to the city, Ford has out-bid New York bankers, and has permitted the city to borrow at 4 per cent interest instead of the 6½ demanded by moneylenders in the east.
The money loaned by the motor king was badly needed, as the city did not have enough funds in the bank to meet pay checks of the board of education, which were due today.
It is generally considered that New York bankers will resent Ford's dealings with Detroit, as in the last several years Wall street has handled practically all of the city's financing. Detroit banks have been unable to lend money at the rates quoted in New York, owing to lower discount rates. When Controller Nagel recently sought a short-term loan, New York bankers demanded 4½ per cent interest. The motor king has already advanced \$500,000 at 4 per cent.
It is believed that Ford's entrance into the Detroit financial field means that he will be in the market for bonds which the city will issue. He is known to have a profound distaste for Wall street and its methods of financing, at least as far as Detroit is concerned.
As a result of the Ford loan the city will begin on Monday its program of street railway extensions. The \$2,000,000 will let the D. V. R. get well under way with its street car extensions, and next week will see start of improvements.
Some of Ford's money also will be used to meet payrolls of city employees until city taxes start coming in July 15. The city has no money left from last year's taxes to meet these obligations.

CHINESE TROOPS WILL "DIG THE BANDITS OUT"

Brigands Move Captives Two Miles Further Into the Hills.

Tsao Chwang, May 25.—Gunfire heard near here yesterday is taken to indicate that government troops are engaging the bandits in the hills, or the bandits are fighting among themselves as a result of a disagreement at their conference which was scheduled for today. It was learned today from different sources that the brigands have taken their captives from Paotzuku mountain and have moved them two miles farther back into the hills.
The sudden retirement appears to indicate that the troops, acting under orders from Tsao Kun, inspector-general of Shantung, are following the plan advocated by the Tsuchun of the province to "dig the bandits out."

SOVIET FORCES ARREST FOREIGNERS IN RUSSIA

Copenhagen, May 25.—A Moscow report by way of Berlin says that the Soviet authorities at Petrograd, Moscow and Kiev have arrested several Swiss citizens. A number of Swiss shops have been wrecked at the first named city, while at Odessa three Swiss were attacked. The Soviet government is said to have prohibited visas for Swiss passports.

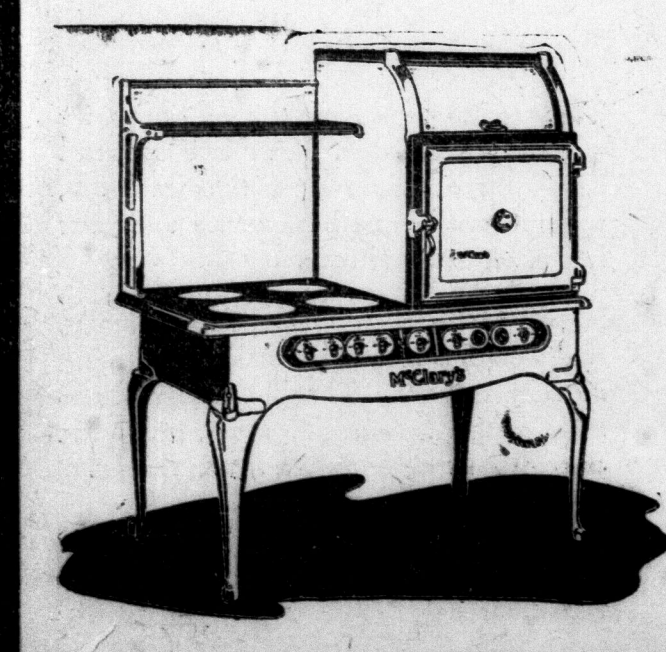
