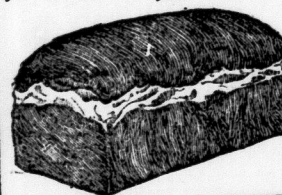

## SINN FEINERS BOYCOTT IRISH SENATE ELECTION

Dublin, Sept. 17.—No Irish election has ever provoked so little public excitement as the country-wide Free State elections for the senate in which the voters were balloting today.

No political issue is involved, and the Republicans, under direction of the Sinn Fein executives, are boycotting the elections altogether. All men and women over 20 are permitted to vote, and there are 1,300,000 qualified voters, but it is calculated that less than one-third will cast ballots.

## STREET RAILWAY HAS BIG INCREASE

Cars Expect To Carry 300,000  
Passengers During Fair  
Week.

Business is good with the London Street Railway Company. This week the street railway cars will carry something like 300,000 passengers over the metropolis and provide a record in fair week history.

According to statements yesterday at a directors' meeting, 5,000 passengers were carried on Wednesday, an unprecedented figure for fair week. Indications last night were that yesterday would exceed Wednesday's traffic.

Reconstruction of Ridout street bridge and its relationship to improvement of South London service brought out much talk, but, according to statements following the meeting, no definite proposals were made.

Street railway problems, from alpha to omega, were discussed at a meeting of directors yesterday. Some length without providing decisions that directors are ready to make public. According to officials of the road, they cannot continue negotiations with the city unless the present appeal against the railway board's fares decision is dropped. ## LONDONER ORDAINED TO BAPTIST MINISTRY

William Smith, Former Mission  
Head, Joins Ranks of  
Clergy.

William Smith, of this city, was ordained to the ministry of the Baptist church, at an impressive ceremony in Adelaide street church last evening. Rev. Mr. Smith had formerly been in charge of the Christian Workers' Mission on Ottawa street, and he decided to seek ordination in the Baptist church. Mr. Smith will assume charge of the Kensal Park Baptist church within a few weeks.

The council called by the Middlesex-Lambton association of Baptist churches, consisting of two day delegates from each church and the minister, met in Adelaide street church yesterday afternoon. The candidate's qualifications were considered and found suitable. Rev. R. H. Mackay was chosen moderator, and he called upon Mr. Smith to relate his story of the Christian life, and of his call to the ministry.

Mr. Smith then told the story of his religious experiences, and of why he felt that he was called to preach the gospel. After hearing it, the council formally decided to admit Mr. Smith to the ministry.

The ordination service was held in the evening, and the Rev. Bowley Green preached the sermon. He exhorted the candidate to be always faithful to the gospel, and to preach it fearlessly. He spoke of the difficulties which come with the serving of God, but added that God never left the faithful in their difficulties. His one supreme message, however, was to be a devoted follower of Jesus, and the other things would come.

The newly-ordained clergyman replied suitably.

Supper was served to the visiting delegates by the ladies of the church.
