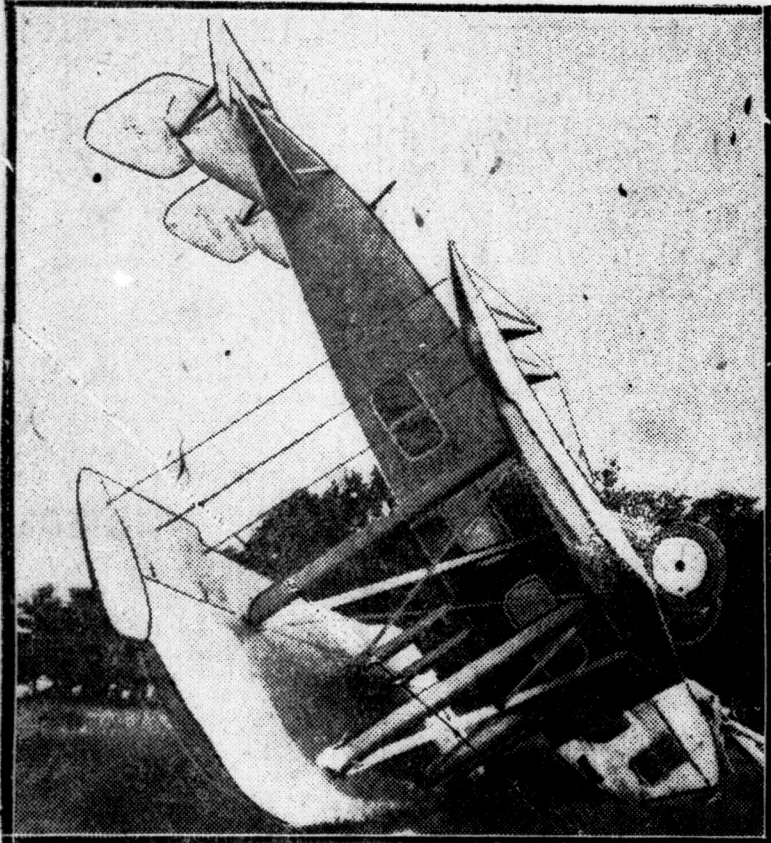
Picnics are lots of fun, but even they get tiresome sometimes. These young ladies were caught unawares enjoying a short siesta.

The future emperor of the Japanese empire dressed for his daily ride in smart attire. Prince Hirokito is an enthusiastic sportsman.



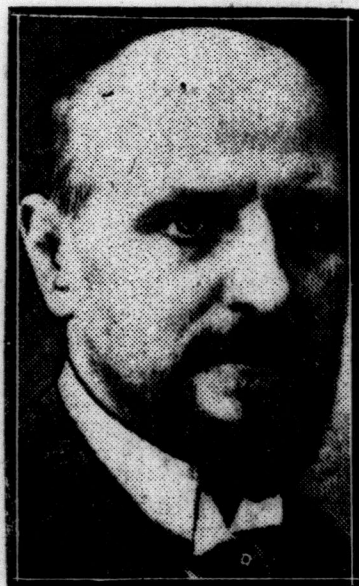
Mme. Trini, famous Spanish dancer, has returned to America after a visit to her native country. She feels quite gay about it.



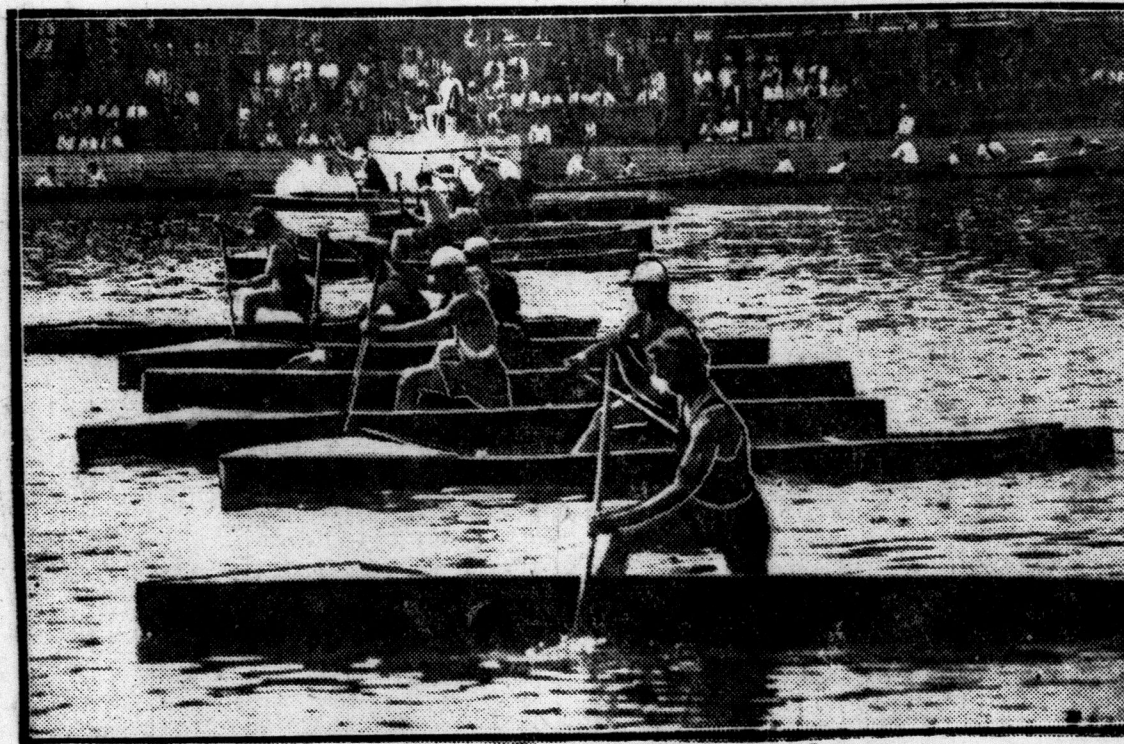

The start of the junior singles race of the Canadian Canoe Association at Port Dalhousie. J. Priestly of Humber Bay carried off the honors.



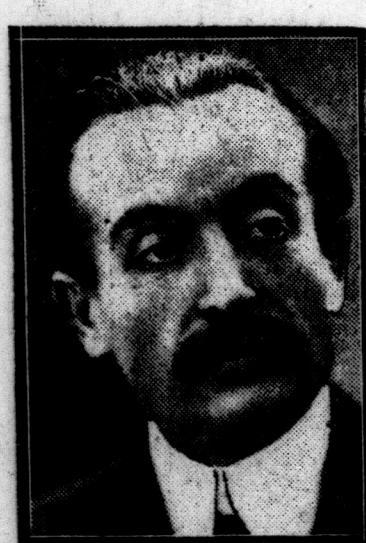

Sophie Braslau has appeared in the role of a squaw guide at the American pageant in Seattle, where she sang "The Robin Woman's Song."



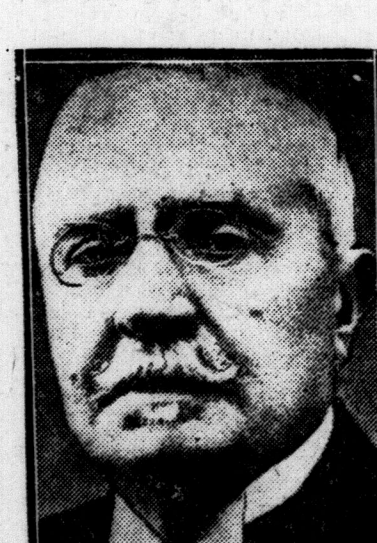
Bonnie Macleary, famous sculptor of Greenwich Village, has just completed her masterpiece, Apollo, for a Texas oil king.
