

DRIFTING INTO ANARCHY.

ENGLAND MUST UNDO THE CONTROL OF EGYPT.

A Cabinet Meeting—No Relief to be sent to Gen. Gordon—A Bureau that must be shouldered.

LONDON, April 4.—The Pall Mall Gazette says: "Egyptian affairs are fast drifting into anarchy, and through anarchy to an annexation or war, possibly both. England must undertake the administration of Egypt. It will be a terrible burden, but the country must shoulder it manfully."

MILWAUKEE, Wis., April 4.—George Leo, colored, aged 18, arrested in McComb city, to-day for assault on a girl 4 years of age, was lodged here in jail. This evening over a hundred men took the prisoner from the jail and took to McComb, where they hanged him.

A Sash and Door Factory Burned.

COVINGTON, April 4.—Last night about 11 o'clock, a fire broke out in the heading work sash and door factory, owned by Lumine & Jones, and completely demolished it. Loss about \$10,000; no insurance.

A Cincinnati Editor Sentenced.

CINCINNATI, April 4.—The first sentencing of the prisoners since the riot took place to-day. Belle Osborne, colored, convicted of assault with intent to kill, received seven years.

THE MAGISTRATES OF IRELAND.

A Suggestion That They Should be Elected by Popular Vote.

LONDON, April 4.—In the commons this evening Justin McCarthy moved that the condition of the Irish magistracy, constituted as it is almost entirely of one religious denomination, and one class, is offensive and injurious to the majority of the people and calculated to destroy confidence in the administration of justice.

Mr. Trevelyan declared the system of popular election could never be adopted. The Irish chancellor would impartially exercise his power in regard to the appointment of magistracy.

Mr. McCarthy's motion was rejected by a vote of 108 to 68.
