This act, however, did not apply to railways within the city. He spoke bitterly of the action of The World, which had advised the deputation to go home and mind their own business. However doubtful he may previously have been as to the wisdom of his action, the reading of the article convinced him that he was in the The Alliance," said Mr. Patterson,
