IN THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, Semi-Annual Session, 1898.

Council met in the Court House, Bridgetown, on Tuesday the 10th day of April, instant, at 10 o'clock, a. m. Present: The Warden, Councillors Healy, Whitman, Fitch, J. A.
