## REPORT ON BANDS OF HOPE :

In the performance of my duty as General Agent for Bands of Hope I have much pleasure in reporting this branch of our army as steadily progressing and commanding a larger amount of attention from the Members and Lady Visitors of our Order. In the absence of actual returns I have made the subjoined table from the returns of last year and the members who were admitted at the formation of the Bands during the present year, and trust that full and accurate returns may be received previous to the Quarterly Session in April next.

By this report it will be seen that there have been organized during the year, 22 Bands with 852 members, the large majority of whom are over nine years of age, and it is to be earnestly hoped that the largest number of those thus early drawn into the temperance ranks will remain faithful through life.
