

Household Hints.
THE BEST EXERCISE.—Walking is the best of exercise, and if spirited, and the arms be allowed to swing freely, it brings into play the muscles of the upper part of the body as well as the lower half. Walking, if well managed, is better in one respect than exercise in a gymnasium, where you get little sunlight, and where you are likely to breathe the dust and impure air.
SNOW DROPS.—One cup of butter, two cups of sugar, whites of five eggs, one small cup of milk, three full cups of prepared flour, flavour with vanilla and nutmeg; bake in small round tins. Those in the shape of fluted shells are very pretty.

SPONGE GINGERBREAD.—One cup sour milk, one cup molasses, one-half cup butter, one cup brown sugar, two eggs, two teaspoons ginger, one of soda and flour enough to thicken.
BISCUIT.—Sift with one quart flour three teaspoonsful Cleveland's Superior Baking Powder and one-half teaspoonful salt. Rub into flour shortening (butter and lard mixed) the size of an egg and mix together with enough sweet milk to make a soft dough. Roll out quickly in sheets nearly one inch thick; cut the desired size, crowd close together in the pan and bake twenty minutes. Knead as little as possible.

SYRUP.—Excellent syrup that will pass for maple can be made by taking one pound maple sugar, three pounds granulated sugar; add one quart of water and boil gently till it thickens. The time of boiling is uncertain, but test by setting off the fire; if a crust of sugar does not form on the top it is about right.
