





## THE FARM.

Keep the sheep thriving all winter. Get rid of every fattening cattle beest before it is three years old.

It pays to keep one man in constant attendance on thirty head of fattening cattle. Stall feeding is better for fat making than box or yard management, irrespective of

Immediately when an animal begins to fret for food, immediately it begins to lose flesh; never check the fattening pr cess.

The best soi's for farming purposes are based on limestone foundation. It is only where lime abounds that good wheat can be grown. There is now such sharp competition in the

sale of commercial fertilizers that there is little advantage in farmers buying the chemicals and mixing for themselves.

Sheep should have their feet trimmed at least twice a year. If they are not trimmed the hoof curls under at the edges and retains a mass of filth and dirt which is apt to cause

The growing animal, intended for beef, requires a little exercise daily to promote muscle and strength of constitution; when ripe, only so much as to be able to walk to na ket. The receipts of calves at Chicago this year have been almost double those of 1883. The bulk of the increase, though, has been

of last year. Keep a few sheep on the farm, if not any. Wool will always bring cash at many. some price, and it comes off when there is little else to sell. Mutton always sells well and is always good for the table. Keep

sieep. In very cold weather it is difficult to make some cows drink as much as they should. Giving them a daily small ration of salt in their feed will increase their demand for drink. When fed partly with roots or green food twice watering will answer. Fattening cattle often drink but once a day.

A shovelful of manure over a hill of hops will prove a great protection to the roots, and its soluble portions will be incorporated with the soil so as to benefit the crop to the full extent next season. The hop root is often injured during severe winters from deep freezing of the soil.

It is a good plan for a farmer to grow two or three short rows of apple trees, planting the seeds, grafting at the root, the winter they are a year old, with varieties desired. Some of these trees he will probably wish to plant himself, and what he has left can readily be sold to neighbors when the trees are old enough to plant.

Although clay is less easily worked than lighter soils, a good admixture of it is desirable in growing all kinds of fruit except peaches and grapes. Even for grapes a well drained clay is preferable to a sandy soil. The pear blights less on heavy soil, perhaps because they are not liable to sudden change in temperature.

It is sometimes advisable to plant an apple orchard on land so stony that it cannot be ploughed, and, indeed, where holes can scarcely be dug to set the young trees. It is not necessary to dig a hole. Set the trees on the surface and bring in rich earth from somewhere else to cover the roots as deeply as needed. The trees will thrive better than if set in a hole.

Where the grain is only to be used for feeding, oats and peas are sometimes grown together. The practice is an excellent one, as the two grains will produce more feed than either grown separately. They are also good when cut green for soiling purposes or for putting into the soil. Peas are strong, rich feed, and their vines shade the ground so completely that they act as a mulch to the soil luring the hottest weather, Oats growing with peas keep the vines of the latter from falling down.

## NOVA SCOTIA.

The imports of sugar during the year 1884 from the West India Islands, Demerara, China and Brazil, on account of Halifax consignees, amounted to 20,020 hogsheads, 1,572 tierces, 5,043 barrels and 272,648 bags. There were received here on account of consignees in Moneton, Montreal, Toronto, &c., 2,860 hogsheads, 288 tierces, 5,043 barrels and 104,317 bags. The imports during the previous year for Halifax consignees were 14,228 hogsheads, 2,256 tierces, 4,993 barrels and 83,547 bags, and on account of Moneton, Montreal, etc., 2,106 hogsheads, 126 tierces, 314 barrels and 175,-022 bags. The receipts of molasses at the port of Halifax during the year aggregated 10,060 puncheons, \$18 tierces and 959 barrels. The receipts of 1883 were 16,883 pun-cheons, 1,099 tierces and 1,332 barrels. Major Henry Hare, of the Royal Munster

NEW YORK CANAL REPORT.

ALBANY, N. Y., Jan. 7.—The annual report of the superintendent of public works shows that the expenditures during the year for repairs and aperating expenses on the state canals were \$718,000. The canal tonnage from May 6th to December 1st, 1884, was 5,009,488, a decrease compared with 1883 of 654,563 tons. The decrease was brought about by untoward circumstances, such as the decreased export demand for articles weather. for articles usually carried by the canals, and the increased opposition faout the railroads for carrying freight for the past season, which has never been paralleled, owing to the war in rates. During the past season the levels have been kept to standard depth, there have been no interruptions save those caused by breaks, and interruptions save those caused by breaks, and boats have made unusually fast trips. Increased facilities for water supply are strongly recommended for the long levels between Utica and Syracuse and Lockport and Rochester. The superintendent says: Observation has shown that the supply of water in the upper Hudson is falling. During last season the guard gates at the head of the Glen's Falls feeder were opened to their full width for a whole mouth, during to their full width for a whole month, during which time all the water of the Hudson has been taken into the canal, with barely sufficient for navigation.
