

- (b) retained on board aircraft of a designated airline of one Contracting Party upon arriving in or leaving the territory of the other Contracting Party; or
- (c) taken on board aircraft of a designated airline of one Contracting Party in the territory of the other Contracting Party,

whether or not the items are used or consumed wholly within the territory of the Contracting Party granting the exemption, provided that those items are not alienated in the territory of that Contracting Party.

3. The regular airborne equipment, as well as the materials and supplies normally retained on board the aircraft of a designated airline of either Contracting Party, may be unloaded in the territory of the other Contracting Party only with the approval of the Customs authorities of that territory. In this case, they may be placed under the supervision of those authorities until they are re-exported or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the Customs regulations applicable in the territory of the other Contracting Party.

4. The Contracting Parties shall ensure that baggage and cargo in direct transit across their territory are exempt from customs duties and other similar charges.

5. The exemptions provided for by this Article shall also be available in situations where a designated airline of one Contracting Party has entered into arrangements with another airline for the loan or transfer in the territory of the other Contracting Party of the items specified in paragraph 1 provided that other airline similarly enjoys such exemptions from the other Contracting Party.

## **ARTICLE 10**

### **Statistics**

Each Contracting Party, through its aeronautical authorities, shall provide, or shall cause its designated airlines to provide to, the aeronautical authorities of the other Contracting Party, on request, periodic or other statements of statistics as may be reasonably required for the purpose of reviewing the operation of the agreed services, including statistics showing the initial origins and final destinations of the traffic.

## **ARTICLE 11**

### **Tariffs**

1. For the purposes of this Article:
  - (a) "tariff" means a publication which includes all rates, fares, charges, conditions of carriage, classifications, rules, regulations, related practices and services, for air transportation of passengers and their baggage and cargo but excludes remuneration and conditions for the carriage of mail;
