before getting up and making use of it in the house with the obvious inferences that follow from it?

Mr. COLDWELL: No, I do not think so, because the statement upon which the hon. member for Vancouver North based his question had been made publicly throughout Canada, and if I were minister of national defence I would welcome a question that

would enable me to say what the Minister of National Defence said a few moments ago.

Mr. DOUGLAS (Weyburn): Are we dealing with the section clause by clause?

The CHAIRMAN: We are on subsection 1. Section stands.

Progress reported.

At six o'clock the house adjourned, without question put, pursuant to standing order.
