- 1. Did Canadian Pacific Airlines apply to the air transport board or to the government for permission to fly a new international route or routes, or to add to its present routes the right to stop over in certain countries?

- 3. Have these applications been heard; and, if so, (a) by whom (b) what decision has been rendered?
- 4. Is Canadian Pacific Airlines authorized, under its bilateral air agreements or otherwise, to carry local traffic between two points in a foreign country or between several points in one foreign country to one or more points in another foreign country; and, if so, list the points?

Hon. Leon Balcer (Minister of Transport):

- 1. Yes.
- 2. Canadian Pacific Airlines has applied for the following international routes—

- (a) Western Canada—(Vancouver-Edmonton)—London.
- (b) (Toronto-Montreal)—London (using propeller-driven aircraft only).
- 3. (a) This application has been heard by a special cabinet committee, and (b) no decision has yet been rendered.
- 4. No Canadian air line is permitted under any bilateral air agreement to carry local traffic between two points in a foreign country. In operating its overseas service, Canadian Pacific Airlines is authorized to carry traffic between the following points in foreign countries:

Mexico City-Lima (Peru) Lima-Santiago (Chile) Santiago-Buenos Aires (Argentina) Tokyo-Hong Kong Honolulu-Fiji-Auckland (New Zealand)-

Sydney (Australia) Azores-Lisbon-Rome
