

(b) the study of law,

(c) training in the practise of law.

B. The period of study for those taking a university law course should be four years. During this period they should receive both theoretical and practical training.

The practical training may consist of actual work in a law office or of work of a practical nature carried on under the direction of the university staff. It may be carried on concurrently with the theoretical study or consist of one year of full-time office work following a three year full-time university law course.

IV. In accordance with all our traditions admission to the legal professions is a prerogative of those professions themselves yet it is desirable that in exercising that prerogative the professional societies take account of the process of preparation (formation) and that the examination regulations be so framed as to be fair to all groups of candidates.
