Q. And what is the date of the publication? A. It was originally printed in July of 1937 and this one was issued in June of 1939.

Q. From what place? A. From Continental headquarters in New York city.

Q. And the policy of the Canadian branch of Technocracy is in full accord with Technocracy in the United States?

A. At the present time, do you mean?

Q. I mean the United States technical programme.

A. It is one organization, we do not make any distinction.

Q. You do not disagree with them at all? A. No Technocrat can disagree.

Q. What I want to know is, in 1942, on May 9th, the Toronto Saturday Night carried a clipping which referred to a full page advertisement appearing in the San Francisco Chronicle which reads as follows:

"If any Canadians had any qualms about the banning of Technocracy in this country, they should be set at rest by even the slightest examination of the campaign which that amazing organization, with great expenditure of money for advertising and offices, is now staging in California and other parts of the western States. The San Francisco Chronicle carried last week a full page advertisement (which it denounced with great editorial vigor in the following issue) calling for the complete and immediate confiscation of all the property, money and business, and the conscription of the persons, of all the inhabitants of the United States under the final authority of an individual always referred to as "Commander-in-Chief" and never as "President". This authority is to supersede all state and local governments, to collect all their taxes, local and national, to operate all businesses, to command all persons, to suppress all
