

this regulation, for which they shall be personally responsible; and I flatter myself that their zeal, in assisting me to restore the public prosperity, will not be momentary; convinced as they must be that Liberty cannot exist without Industry.

This present Regulation shall be printed, read, published, and posted up wherever it is necessary, even on plantations; so that no one may pretend ignorance thereof. It shall likewise be sent to all the Civil and Military Authorities, together with my Proclamation of the 25th Brumaire above mentioned; which for that purpose shall be reprinted, so that every one may conform strictly to the duties required of him.

Given at Head-quarters, Port Republicain,
Vendemiaire 20th, ninth year of the
French Republic, one and indivisible.

The Author cannot be answerable for the accuracy of the above paper, which bears some marks of incorrect translation.
