

11th. The Secretary shall enter in a book kept for that purpose minutes of all resolutions and other transactions of the Society.

12th. The Treasurer shall submit to the annual meeting an explicit statement of the financial affairs of the Society, and such statement shall undergo a previous examination by auditors appointed by the Committee, to whom the necessary vouchers shall be submitted.

13th. No money shall be expended by the Treasurer without an order signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Committee of Management on behalf of and by authority of the Committee, and all the money collected by the Treasurer beyond the sum of £10 shall be deposited by him in such bank as the Committee shall direct.

14th. At General Meetings all observations shall be addressed to the Chairman.

15th. The subject of discussion must be strictly attended to and no discussion on any proposition being concluded, the President or Chairman elect, as the case may be, shall put the question to the meeting, to be decided by a majority, the President or Chairman having the casting vote.

16th. Every resolution proposed to the meeting must be seconded and reduced to writing, and an amendment being moved and seconded, must be disposed of before the original question be put.

17th. All local politics of the day as well as all religious subjects shall be strictly excluded.

18th. No personal allusion shall be allowed and any reference to arguments used by members who have spoken must be made with the utmost courtesy of expression.

19th. The President or Chairman shall not take part in the debate upon any question, but he shall be
