fleeting Tabernacle, and place him in his heavenly, unchanging Abode.

To imprefs these important Truths more deeply on the Minds of the Corinthians, the Apostle tells them, that God himfelf was the Author of this whole Economy. From Motives of Love he had wifely fubjected them to Trials, the more effectually to fecure their Salvation. By his Grace, operating in their Hearts, he raifed them to those fublime Views, and Defires after Immortality. His Spirit had wrought this Temper in them, and was a Pledge and Earnest of their future Glory. Nothing can be more conducive to fortify a Christian against Afflictions, Sufferings and Death, than what is urged to this Purpofe, at V. 5. "Now he that hath " wrought," or prepared and framed, " us for " the felf-fame Thing, is God, who hath alfo " given unto us the Earnest of the Spirit."

THE Confequence of these Particulars, and the Effects produced by them in the Apostle and other fincere Christians, we have in my Text, which immediately follows---" Therefore we are " always confident; knowing that whils we are " at Home in the Body, we are absent from the " Lord."

We are always confident---that is, undifmayed at Sufferings or Death, and undaunted in the Difcharge of each Christian Duty.

KNOWING that whilft we are at Home in the Body---that is, whilft we fojourn in the Body; for the Apoftle refers to what he had faid before, and wants to fhew that the Body is not our proper Houfe

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
