DENIES THAT ALIEN LABOR IS BEING USED

No Truth in Union's Charges, Says Manager of Hamilton Bridge Works.

HAMILTON, May 5.—(Special.)—The charge of bringing in alien labor to take the places of the striking structural ironworkers is emphatically denied by R. M. Roy, manager of the Hamilton Bridge Works, in a statement to The Toronto World to-night.

The striking carpenters deny that any of their number have gone back to work at less than 40 cents an hour, the scale demanded. More than 25 contractors have signed up, and the men state that they are well satisfied with the progress of the strike.

The Trades and Labor Council met to-night and decided not to appoint delegates to the provincial federation until expressions of opinion are received from the local President.

WASHINGTON, May 5.—Representative Warburton of Washington, a newly elected Republican member of the house of representatives, announced the intention of supporting the Democratic free list bill, in a speech in this house this afternoon.

Mr. Warburton said many of the Republican criticisms of the bill were undoubtedly well founded, but others overdrawn. He believed the bill would not do all its Democratic sponsors expected of it, but it was a step in the right direction.
