men throughout the country.

## NEARLY BURNED TO DEATH

Miss Cronyn, an Employee of Whit-

worth &amp; Restall, 120 Bay

Street, Narrowly Escapes.

JUMPED FROM THE THIRD STOREY

Her Injuries May Prove Fatal—

Damage by the Fire Amounts

to \$9000.

The premises of Whitworth &amp; Restall,

mattress manufacturers, at 120 Bay-street,

were partially destroyed by fire yesterday

afternoon.

William McInerney first saw the fire, be-

ing attracted by the sound of falling glass.

He gave the alarm.

There were three men, two boys and one

woman employed on the third floor, whence

flames issued. Escape by the stairway

was threatened by flames. The men, how-

ever, risked it, and slid down the banis-

ter.

Woman Could Not Go.

Miss Cronyn had not the nerve to fol-

low. She went to the window and cried

for help.

A mattress was placed in position and

Miss Cronyn told to jump, and she did.

She hit on the mattress. She was taken

down to the hospital, where it was found

her back was badly burned, the hair of

her head destroyed and her ankle sprained.

The Casualty Reserve.

The doctors say that Miss Cronyn will

likely die, as she is injured internally, and

has suffered a great shock. She is 27

years of age, and lives at 60 Walmer-road.

The fire was soon put under control.

The building is owned by Sanderson

Parry, and damaged to the extent of

\$2500, fully insured in the Quebec Com-

pany. The stock was damaged to the

extent of \$500, and is partly covered by

insurance in the Canadian and Quebec

companies.

It is thought the fire originated in the

basement.
