An interesting story about the Cheques Given by the Town of Orillia to Her Volunteers. Orillia, Jan. 18.—There is an interesting story attached to the cheques for \$25,000 which remained "out" for over a year. William Reid and Tom Thomson, on their leaving for South Africa, 15 months ago, which retained "out" for over a year. The cheques did not reach the recipients in Quebec until it was too late to get them cashed before sailing for the Cape. The boys turned them over to Capt. Arnold for safe keeping. When that gallant officer was killed at Paardeberg, his effects were left in the hands of Lieut. Richard. When this officer was also killed on his way up the line while commanding the Orillians looked upon the cheques as lost, and the bank came home under that impression. But before leaving South Africa the Orillians cashed his own in London, and found the proceeds used for "doing" the Imperial metropolis and brought his comrade's home with him.
