The figures regarding the general position of the liquor traffic in the community can only be obtained in the form of estimates. F. S. Spence, in his digest of the report of the Canadian royal commission of 1892, placed the capital invested in breweries, distilleries and mait houses at \$15,588,953; the value of real estate occupied by vendors of liquor at \$38,000,000; the value of fixtures, etc., connected with the trade at \$21,000,000; the wages, taxes and payments by brewers and distillers at \$5,039,966; payments for importabliquors at \$1,901,000; wages paid by retail and wholesale liquor interest at \$10,500,000. The federal excise licenses, etc., were over \$7,000,000, and the provincial and municipal licenses \$1,350,00)—a total of over \$100,000,000 invested in the business. The minority report of the royal commission of 1892 estimated the cost of this traffic to Canada at \$143,000,000, of which \$76,000,000 was attributed to the "loss of productive labor." In an article contributed to The Toronto Globe of March 9, 1901, the Rev. Dr. Charles A.
