A definite ruling with respect to the status of 19 and 20-year-old men who are married, but who come within the provisions of the proclamation of May 4, was received Friday at the office of the deputy registrar. The ruling was communicated in the form of a telegram, signed by the director of the military service council, and clears up a point with respect to status that many men in this district will be pleased to have explained.

Under this ruling men of 19 years of age, who attained the age of 19 prior to April 20th, and who were married before April 20th last, are to be considered for all purposes of the act married men, and are in Class 2. 
