## EIGHTEEN-YEAR-OLD MOTHER TO FACE TRIAL FOR MURDER

Mrs. Lena Cassak Shot Man After He Knocked Her Down.

WINDSOR, Oct. 21.—Sustaining objections from the Crown attorney, Magistrate Miles at the Ontario court refused to grant bail to Mrs. Lena Cassak, a Rumanian resident of Ford City, and declined to reduce the charge against her from murder to manslaughter. Instead, she committed her for trial at the fall assizes, which open at Sandwich on November 1.

Barrister Wilson, appearing on behalf of the defendant, made a strong appeal for bail on the ground that Mrs. Cassak is about to become the mother of another child. She is only eighteen years of age, and has been separated from her three-year-old daughter since the shooting affray at her home on September 20, when she fired the shot that caused the death of Andre Wilan. Evidence submitted at the hearing before Magistrate Miles showed that the brawl had commenced when neighbors, who had visited the Cassaks home and demanded payment for a keg of beer, alleged to have been stolen from them. When the invaders produced brass knuckles and commenced to use them with effectiveness, Mrs. Cassak interfered, was thrown to the ground by Wilan and was kicked by him. It was while she was on the ground that the revolver in the hands of the woman went off, and a bullet struck Wilan.

## MEIGHEN GOVT. REFUSES TO AID SALE OF WHEAT

Foster Statement Denies Growers' Request For Control of Crop.

## MUST SELL IN OPEN

Considers Trade Commission Denial of Blame For Sugar Losses.

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—(By the Canadian Press).—"The Government is carefully watching the various purchasing systems employed and marketing conditions generally in this and other countries, and is ready to take steps to insure the fair marketing of Canadian wheat should a situation such as last year's develop again."

In these words Sir George Foster, minister of trade and commerce, in a statement issued this afternoon, sums up the attitude of the Government towards plans for resumption of government control on the marketing of wheat. This means that Canadian wheat growers will have to sell in the open market.

Demand Was Made. In this statement, Sir George says: "Demand has been made by the United Farmers of Alberta and the Dominion Council of Agriculture and various associations of grain growers for the re-establishment of control of the Canadian wheat market through a board similar to that which functioned last year. The demand is made because of the drop in current wheat prices and the thought that a wheat board could assure a higher price."

"The law of supply and demand has everything to do with the basic determination of the world price for wheat. Circumstances of transport by sea, or land, financial and exchange conditions and methods of buying may temporarily affect and vary the price, but the determining factor is the relation of the supply to the demand. The price will vary from time to time by greater or lesser pressure to buy arising from the supply temporarily on hand or readily available."

Methods of Selling. "The condition that the fact that prices this year are less than those of last year is due only to different methods of selling will not bear analysis. If the board were to be re-established as last year a Canadian embargo on both the export and import of wheat would presumably have to follow."

With the United States market open and the Canadian market under control the tendency would be to free purchasing in the American market by other countries and the consequent stopping back of the Canadian wheat movement."

### NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR SUGAR PURCHASE, STATES COMMISSION

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—(Canadian Press).—"Clearing up accumulations of business prior to the departure of the prime minister on his western tour, the cabinet council again had a meeting this morning. Wheat and the situation of the sugar refiners are the questions most at issue."

In respect to sugar the Government has not yet taken any action beyond that of maintaining suspension of the order issued by the board of commerce. It is, however, regarded as probable that the refiners will again visit Ottawa to press their case. Their proposals of a large loan or of a readjustment of the customs duties on raw sugar are understood to be meeting with considerable opposition, and there is doubt in official circles if the Government will be in a position to lend the refiners any material assistance.

The fact that the Canadian Trade Commission denies responsibility for the refiners' acquisition of large stocks of high-priced raw sugar has brought a new element into the discussion so far as the effect of control is concerned.

## SUGAR BEET GROWERS WANT \$1 A TON MORE

Proposals Presented To Sugar Refiners At Conference Held Yesterday.

CHATHAM, Oct. 21.—Representatives of the Ontario Beet Growers' Association, in conference with the directors of the Dominion Sugar Company regarding the price of sugar beets, Beets not delivered at the factory, for next year, asked the following prices:

\$10 per ton, when sugar is selling at \$8 per cwt., and an increase of \$1.50 per ton for every dollar increase per cwt. in the price of sugar. This means that if sugar is selling at \$8 per cwt., beets will be \$10 per ton; if sugar is selling at \$9 per cwt., beets will be \$11.50 per ton.

For beets delivered at the factory \$10 per ton is asked for 12 per cent beets, with an increase of 60 cents for every 1 per cent increase in sugar content, or, in other words, beets testing 12 per cent \$10 per ton and those testing 13 per cent \$10.60 per ton.

The minimum price this year is \$9 per ton, with \$1 increase for the same increase in the price of sugar. At the factory \$9 per ton for 14 per cent beets and \$1 additional for increase of each 1 per cent.

The growers maintain that the high cost of land and labor and the risk involved make the proposed price necessary. The company will consider the proposal.

## ONLY ONE CRIMINAL CASE ON DOCKET FOR LAMBTON ASSIZES

Two Foreigners Face Charges of Attempted Murder and Assault.

SARNIA, Oct. 21.—It was announced tonight that facing two indictments each, Ivan Turkovich and John Stanek will be arraigned at the assizes which open here on Monday with Justice Orde presiding. The charges against Turkovich are attempting to murder Profero (Pete) Bayduk, and making an assault and wounding Bayduk. Stanek is charged with aiding and abetting Ivan Turkovich in an attempt to murder Bayduk. This is the only case on the criminal docket at W. Wilson county crown attorney, will act as crown counsel at the assizes.
