CORNWALL, May 2.—(Special)—Up to a late hour this evening portions of the remains of ten bodies have been recovered from the ruins of the Rossmore Hotel fire.

This leaves the bodies of but two Montreal lads, Buller and Hume, to be recovered.

The remains of Mrs. Archibald will be taken to the cemetery at Woodlands tomorrow for interment.
