CATTLE MARKET IS SLOW AND LOWER

**Feeder Trade Is Fairly Good
—Hogs on Down
Grade.**

There was a run of about 850 fresh head
of cattle at the Union Yards yesterday,
but the whole trend of the market was
distinctly dull and dragging, and it seems
a hopeless task to get up any enthusiasm
at the yards these days.

The long period of comparatively low
prices has had a discouraging effect on
the drovers, and the commission houses are
having a hard time of it disposing of their
consignments at satisfactory prices to their
shippers, and themselves. Not many real
good butcher cattle are coming forward,
and when they do they sell readily enough
at the decline. The stocker and feeder
trade not so bad, but that there is a
fairly good demand for the better class
Ontario farmers taking them on at
current prices. There is always a reason-
ably good demand for the better class of
milkers and springers, especially where the
latter are close up sales where more than
average promise.

The lamb trade was a shade firmer.
The lamb trade at \$12.25, the top of
two extra choice lots bringing \$12.25.
Sheep and calves held steady, selling
from \$6.50 to \$7.50, and calves \$15
to \$17 for good veals.

The hog market was running around
\$14.00 f.o.b., and \$15.00 fed, with prospects
for lower quotations.

Corbett & Hall's quotations yesterday
were: Choice butchers, \$9.50 to \$10; good
butchers, \$8 to \$8.50; medium butchers, \$7
to \$7.50; common butchers, \$6 to \$6.50;
choice cows, \$7.50 to \$8; good cows, \$6.50
to \$7; medium cows, \$5.50 to \$6; common
cows, \$4 to \$4.50; heavy bulls, \$9;
medium bulls, \$8 to \$8.50; choice sheep,
\$6.50 to \$7; heavy sheep, \$5 to \$5.50;
lamb, \$12 to \$12.50; calves, \$15 to \$16.50.

Butcher & Eggs.
Butter continues moderately firm, the
bulk of the sales yesterday going at around
60c to 65c a lb., with some dealers clearing
out at lower prices.

Eggs are scarce and high, and run all
the way from 90c to \$1.10 a dozen. The
prices probably will be maintained, but
fresh eggs are mighty scarce, all reports
to the contrary notwithstanding.

Practically little or no hay is coming in
by wagon, and baled hay is quoted at \$2
to \$3 a ton.
