Mayor Church announced yesterday that he proposed to test the powers of the city to impose a charge on the Bell Telephone Company for the Bell Telephone Company for the use of the streets. He will recommend to the board of control and council that a writ be issued.

"We will endeavor to have defined the rishts of the municipal council to control its streets and to compel the Bell Telephone Co. to pay to every municipality, whose streets they use municipality whose streets they use such sums of money as may be agreed upon between them, and in the absence of such agreements such sums as may be fixed by the Dominion railway commissioners," remarked his worship, who contended that the federal charter under which the operates is ultra vires of the Dominion parliament, inasmuch as that body has that their streets shall be used free of

charge by any corporation.
